Race Safety

All competitors must be a member of Paddle NSW or a Life Saving Club. All competitors' crafts must be self-buoyant. Canoes and kayaks must have fixed buoyancy front and back to keep craft afloat incase of capsize. All paddlers are to determine if the conditions are within their capabilities. If you are unsure, you must wear a 505 or above life jacket or not paddle. You must offer assistance if a paddler is in difficulty. A 50S or above life jacket must be worn if the paddler is under 14 years of age or is not a strong and confident swimmer. The race committee can also deems it nessesary for all paddlers to wear a 50S or above life jacket. All craft must have a clearly visible CSKC race number and finish between the black/white chequered buoys or a time will not be recorded. Please be aware there are other river users including powered craft which need to be avoided. Move to the right of nonoming craft to avoid collision. Follow all channel markers. Stay in the middle of the channel as there are submerged rocks and logs in the river. See course map for details. All turns are anti-clockwise unless advised otherwise. Pink buoys are for separating oncoming craft and turn buoys are yellow. Race briefing 30 minutes before race start.

To be selected for this auspicious role, Lorraine successfully completed the official course for the 2000 Olympics, and worked as an official for that event, and subsequently has officiated at many events since then. This upcoming opportunity marks her first venture has officiating overseas, so it's a massive honour.



A little bit of History. – A story by Geoff Hine

Previous club member Rob Lee resides in Bathurst. In 1980, he competed in the Moscow Olympics, racing in the K2 category alongside Barry Kelly, where they achieved a notable 5th place in the final. During the late 1970s, Rob frequently participated in Saturday afternoon races with the club.

This year, 44 years later, Rob learned of a timber Makka-designed K2 for sale. The seller happened to be Dennis Driscol, a previous and current club member, who, at the time of the Moscow games, was too young to compete but had been a close training partner of Rob's. During their discussion about the boat, Dennis revealed that it



was the very K2 that Rob and Barry had raced in Moscow. Astonished, Rob immediately seized the opportunity and purchased the boat, still bearing the stamp of the Moscow Olympics.

I caught up with Rob in Bathurst earlier this year, where he shared the story with me. Observing that Rob faced a challenge in collecting the boat, I volunteered to drive to Camden and retrieve it for him. The following week, we met at Gray's Point and embarked on a 5km cruise to Audley and back, marking the first time the boat had touched water since 1988.

The paddle excursion proceeded smoothly, with occasional breaks for rest and to savour the experience. For Rob, it was a particularly poignant moment, as it was his first time paddling that specific boat since Moscow, making it a profoundly special occasion for both of us. I felt honoured to accompany him on this journey.

Now contemplating re-joining the club, Rob expressed interest in participating in Saturday races once again, perhaps even with the timber Makka K2.
